### Tēnā koutou e te whānau whānui o Ngā Mokopuna!

## Mātāpono - Principles:

The previously agreed to non-negotiable principles ALL whānau who choose to return their tamariki to kura will adhere to are as follows. They were originally written in Māori in the policy document, but reproduced here bilingually for consideration by Whānau.

- Ka whakapono tētahi ki tētahi.
  - We must all trust that each of us will act responsibly.
- Me hoki 'ora' mai ia tangata tamariki mai, pakeke mai.
  - Everyone who returns, must be WELL.
- Ki te kore tētahi e tino ora ana (hupehupe ana te ihu, maremare ana etc) me noho ki te kāinga.
  - Anyone who is NOT well must stay at home (runny nose, coughing, sneezing, cold, flu symptoms etc)
- Kei ngā mātua te tikanga mehemea ka hoki mai tā rātou tamaiti, tamariki rānei.
  Returning tamariki to kura is voluntary and parents will make the ultimate decision.
- Ka whakapeto ngoi ngā kaiako ki te whakaako i ngā tamariki kia haumaru tonu te katoa. Kaiako will do their utmost to ensure everyone's safety and wellbeing on return to kura.
- Ki te whakaaro tētahi kaiako kāore tētahi tamaiti e tino ora, ka waeahia te whānau ki te tiki mai taua tamaiti.

If a kaiako thinks a child is unwell, the whānau will be contacted immediately to collect that child. This will not be a matter for negotiation.

### Tikanga Whakahaere – Related Procedures:

Vans: Ka haere atu, hoki mai ngā wēne e rua mai i te ata o te Rāpare.

Me mau ārai ngā tāngata katoa mā runga i ngā wēne The vans will operate as usual from Thursday morning

All passengers must wear a face mask.

Kura Devices: Mauria mai i tēnei wiki tonu, hoatu ki tā tāu tamaiti kaiako.

Please return all kura devices this week to your tamaiti's class teacher

Masks: Kei ia whānau te tikanga mehemea ka mau ārai waha e tō rātou tamaiti.

Kāore te kura e whakature ana kia mau ārai ngā tamariki. Kua kite mātou, he uaua

rawa tērā te whakahaere i ngā wā katoa.

It is for each whānau to decide if they want their child to wear a mask on a daily basis.

The kura will not be insisting on it. From last year we know that enforcing mask wearing is too difficult to manage, in addition, we work within a high trust model.
